For a long time I wanted to search for Roman artifacts in Frauenfeld, since it is known that the Roman road from Winterthur up to Pfyn lead through the Allmend.




The beginning

Arrival at Frauenfeld



When I arrived at the Frauenfeld train station, I left the building to the north. My position was at 527/730.

Study the information board. Take the number of the Casino, that's C.



At the Lindenpark



I took the walk along the river Murg. To my right I saw the beautifully landscaped Lindenpark. Shortly after I arrived at 638/883.

At the street light there is a number.

*Take the most left one
and remove 2, that's E.*



The Murg Channel



Next to the Murg Meadow Park there is the Murg Channel with a bench at 690/824.

*How many shelves has the bench?
Add 2, that's D.*



At the bridge



*At 846/689 I crossed the Murg Channel to direction
Murg Meadow Park.*

*How many gratings
(metal squares) has
the bridge? That's B.*




The Buebewäldli Bridge



Soon I arrived at a nice wooden bridge at 851/776 to cross the river Murg.

*How many of the 26 bridges are described on the sign?
This gives F.*



At the barrier



I left the bridge to the left and came to a barrier at 870/787. Count the number of red reflectors and add 4, that's A.

*Now you know, where
the treasure is hidden.
Take the pedestrian
path along the river.*
